In this busy culture, join us as we make time to connect with the God of peace and serenity. Taizé prayer refers to chants that praise God or ask for God's help. During Taizé prayer, everyone repeatedly sings each chant with the choir for several minutes like a mantra. The repetition helps connect those gathered with God, while disconnecting them from life's stress. Taizé prayer originated with an ecumenical community of Christians in Taizé, France, who gather daily to chant and meditate together.
